From the Chairman - Mitchell Slepian



TAPS FOR RED & TAN LINES

If you are old, you recall riding Red & Tan Bus Lines
Route 9 from the George Washington Bridge Bus Terminal to Cam Alpine. The bus would let you off on the riverside, requiring a walk over the highway (9W) on the overpass.

If you are old, you recall getting this bus at 168th and Broadway before the George Washington Bridge Bus Terminal.

You may recall that Red & Tan was a prime source of chartered buses from Brooklyn and Manhattan to TMR (and likely other camps), from Sanita Hills to Camp Brooklyn at Kanawauke Lake (before a TMR).

The Capitani family-owned Red & Tan did a fine job providing commuter and local transit service in Bergen County and Hudson County, NJ. Their charters were on time, clean, and tolerant of boisterous scouts and their camping gear.

Red & Tan was sold years ago and ended up with the Coach USA group which Stagecoach, a Scottish bus company of wide reputation in the UK, owned. They also started Megabus, the intercity carrier in the US and UK. Stagecoach decided to give up its US holdings a few years ago, and most recently, Coach USA announced it was giving up most of its routes in New Jersey. As of this writing, Route 9 still operates (bihourly on weekends) to Alpine, but it's anybody's guess how long this will last or if another company will take it over.

So we now play Taps for Red & Tan and their exemplary service to thousands of Scouts.

Michael Weinman, TMR Arrowhead member was a TMR camper at Kunatah and Davis Lake in the late 50s and early 60s. He attended the 1961 NOAC in Bloomington, IN and was active in Achewen Schingue Chapter of Shu Shu Gah Lodge #24.


