

**Directions** 

### From NYC & Points South

Travel to and take the upper level of the George Washington Bridge. Take your first exit on your right on the New Jersey side (Palisades Parkway). Travel north for 35 miles. Bear to your left and take the exit marked Route 6. Travel half-way round the traffic circle and continue on Route 6 for six miles unto Rt. 17 West. Travel on Route 17 for 44 miles to exit 104 (Monticello Raceway). Travel on 17B for about 6.7 miles into White Lake and blinking light. At 0.7 miles beyond the blinker, make a left hand turn on Rt. 55 West. Follow Rt. 55 for about 4 miles to the Ten Mile River Camp cut-off on the right hand side (County Road 26). Follow County Road 26 to the TMR Museum/Headquarters Camp (see signs).

*Alternative (Scenic) Route* from Rt. 17W (as above) take Exit 121W to I-84 West to Exit 1 (Port Jervis). Make left turn at bottom of ramp, through Port Jervis to Route 97. Follow directions from Western NJ/PA & Points West.

#### From NJ, near Route I-287

Travel north to I-87. Travel on I-87 to the Harriman and Woodbury Common exit (17 West). Pick up Rt. 17 West and follow the directions above.


### From NJ, near Garden State Parkway

Travel on the Garden State Parkway to I-87, taking it west to the exit marked Harriman and Woodbury Common. At that exit, pick up Rt. 17

West and follow the directions above.

From Western NJ/PA & Points West

If near either Rt. 206 or Rt. 23, travel north to Port Jervis. At Port Jervis, pick up Rt. 97 going northwest. Travel on Rt. 97 to County Road 21 (just past Barryville). Take County Road 21 to Yulan and pick up County



#### From Narrowsburg:

Take Route 97 south to County Road 23. Left turn onto County Road 26 at T.M.R. Camp sign. Follow signs to TMR Museum/Headquarters Camp.

The Ten Mile River Scout Museum is operated by the Greater New York Councils, Boy Scouts of America and is dedicated to preserving the history and artifacts of the Ten Mile River Scout Camps and the local area. T.M.R. is a 12,000 acre reserve in Sullivan County near Narrowsburg, N.Y. that has been serving the Boy Scouts of New York City since 1927.

Located in T.M.R.'s Headquarters Camp, the Museum has an extensive collection of T.M.R. memorabilia on display, including photographs, patches, neckerchiefs and slides, signs, banners, maps, literature and physical artifacts. It also has a variety of early Scout uniforms on mannequins.

The comprehensive video collection includes narrated color slide shows, camp documentaries, home movies and interviews with former campers and staffers. Our mini-theater with wide-screen display can seat a group of 15-20 persons. Over 350 staff photos are on display and in the Library.

We also have memorabilia from organizations active at T.M.R., including the Order of the Arrow. The Camp Kernochan Catholic Chapel window is wonderful to see and a highlight of the Museum.

There are exhibits on local history, including the Donut Machine and other items from the Donut Farm, Ten Mile River C.C.C. Camp, colonial coins, metal buttons and other early artifacts dating from the 1700's are on display. See exhibits on the Ten



Mile River Indian Rockshelter, Delaware & Hudson Canal, Erie Railroad, Lumbering, Tanning and Bluestone Mining industries.

The Museum also has a major collection from N.Y.C. Boy Scout summer camps before T.M.R., especially the Kanohwahke Scout Camps in Harriman State Park, N.Y.

## <u>Library</u>

Our Library covers the history of the Kanohwahke Scout Camps, the Ten Mile River Scout Camps, New York City Scouting and local history. See camp and staff photos, biographies, newspaper articles, camp and local maps dating back to 1856 and other paper items. There is also extensive documentation on President Franklin D. Roosevelt and his role in the origin of T.M.R.

Our gift shop has a variety of Museum and T.M.R. publications, patches and collectibles.



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Ten Mile River Wall of Fame

Do you want to recognize some individual, group or organization for their contributions to the Ten Mile River Scout Camps and/or New York City Scouting. A custom-engraved tile on the T.M.R. Wall of Fame, located at the Ten Mile River Scout Museum, might be right for you.

Once the tile is installed, a private or public recognition ceremony can be arranged, typically on T.M.R. Alumni Day in July. Tiles are available in a variety of sizes, colors and materials.

Prices range from \$100-\$1,000 per tile. Laserengraved granite tiles can depict photos, line art and small lettering.
